

Recognising Signs of Deterioration "Is my Resident Well?"

(All Registered Nurses, Managers and Care Staff)

This course is essential for all care staff and nurses and aims to increase knowledge and promote recognition of signs of deterioration in our residents, helping staff to learn the importance of assessing, responding and effectively managing deterioration in health and well-being, to prevent/reduce hospital admissions.

Course Outline:

It will help you recognise signs or changes relating to:

- breathing & coughing
- nutrition & hydration
- bowel habits
- skin
- falls & mobility
- new onset confusion/delirium
- sepsis
- pain
- mood & wellbeing

You will also gain skills and confidence in Advance Care Planning, including:

- Advancing disease
- Increasing decline
- Considerations in the last days of life
- DNACPR/ReSPECT

Plus: urgent clinical support and preparing to call 111, GPs or 999, and SBARD Handover Tool, SPICT, RESTORE2/NEWS2

- THE National Early Warning Score (NEWS2) December 2017 includes *new-onset confusion (delirium) risk factors, causes, symptoms and presentation.
